• Estes is the Center of the Community

Estes Elementary School is one of 18 schools in the Marana Unified School District. In 1955, it was the first elementary school in the district, originally named Marana Elementary School. It was located in buildings currently occupied by the district's administrative offices. In July 2001, a newly constructed Marjorie W. Estes Elementary School opened its doors on the grounds adjacent to the old building. The campus facilities include an outdoor amphitheater, a multipurpose room/cafeteria, a library media center, administrative offices, eight grade-level pods, three modular buildings, a working garden, a tortoise habitat, buddy benches, gaga ball pits and an athletic field with a running track. Estes is proud to be a vital, dynamic center of the community. Our doors are open to community organizations that need space to conduct their activities. Boy Scouts have used the Estes facilities, as have local Marana churches.

• Tortoise Habitat and Community Garden

o In the Fall 2021 and in celebration of Estes Elementary's 20th anniversary, Estes Elementary welcomed a female desert tortoise to the Estes family. A large habitat was built with funds from the generous STEM-Can grant program and donations from local community members. The habitat is located near the Kindergarten playground and G-Building, with the hopes of adding to it and creating spaces for an outdoor classroom, pollinator garden and more. Garden materials for the Tortoise Habitat were donated by Lowe's and other local businesses. These outdoor spaces give our students more hands-on outdoor learning opportunities. Estes Elementary is thankful to have the support of such wonderful community partners. The garden looks amazing, and the efforts of these volunteers provide Estes students with an incredible outdoor learning opportunity for years to come!

Our school offers amazing before and after school high-quality academic intervention and enrichment activities for students along with a broad array of youth development opportunities and parent engagement at no cost. Our program provides opportunities for students to engage in new and exciting learning opportunities and explore their personal interests, recreational and intellectual topics that are often not available during the school day while being able to forge new relationships with friends.

Student Ambassadors

Estes Elementary is proud to have an active group of young student leaders who participate in Student Council and the Sixth Grade Leadership Club. These student leaders are not only ambassadors for the school, but they are amazing helpers, fundraisers, and role models for their student peers. Student Council members help around the school in numerous capacities. They fundraise for school events such as Grandparents' Day, Staff Appreciation, and Teacher Appreciation Day. Funds earned go toward supplies to decorate the school and permanent fixtures – such as playground equipment. Members of the Sixth Grade Leadership Club also are amazing fundraisers and ambassadors for the school. Students regularly visit kindergarten classes and many have formed close friendships with the younger Eagles. They also serve as

gate greeters, welcoming everyone to school with a positive message. Student leaders decorate for special days and also manage recycling around the school on Fridays.




Our Staff

Student Academics and Literacy


At Estes, we use student performance and data to inform our planning. Students are exposed to grade level standards, as well as learning at their individual level of instruction. The State of Arizona has a Move on When Reading statute designed to position students for success as they progress through school, college, and career. As a part of this law, students are required to meet certain reading benchmarks in order to be promoted to the fourth grade. In MUSD, we use Acadience Reading to help teachers identify children at risk for reading difficulties and determine the skills to target for instructional support. We are pleased to report that **ALL of our third grade students met the Move on When Reading requirements** this school year and have been promoted to fourth grade!

End of School year 2022 - 2023 Acadience Reading Benchmark Data Key




Kindergarten End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores




1st Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores



2nd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores




3rd Grade End of Year (2023) Reading Acadience Scores







Standardized Testing Performance 3rd Grade ELA:




Standardized Testing Performance 3rd Grade Math:









Standardized Testing Performance 4th Grade Math:





Standardized Testing Performance 5th Grade ELA:




Standardized Testing Performance 5th Grade Math:








Standardized Testing Performance 6th Grade Math:










State of Arizona Letter Grade: Estes Elementary School currently has a B letter grade from the Arizona Department of Education.

High Reliability Schools

We are excited to announce that Estes Elementary School is OFFICIALLY CERTIFIED in Level One of the High Reliability Schools Framework established by the Marzano Research Group. The focus of this level is "Safe, Supportive, and Collaborative Culture". We are so proud of our school community for coming together to earn this certification.

This year we are focused on Level Two: "Effective Teaching in Every Classroom". We are excited to share action steps we are taking to make sure every student in our school experiences effective instruction every single day.

ACTION STEPS TO SUSTAIN LEVEL ONE

- At Estes, we continue to meet as Collaborative Teams twice a week with all teams meeting in the library on Fridays.
- Teams are led by trained team facilitators who received Collaborative Team Leadership Calibration training while focusing on developing themselves as leaders as well.
- We are increasing parent, student, and staff input through additional input utilizing quarterly Student Forums, quarterly staff and parent quick surveys, and morning Parent Forums (Donuts with Dads or Dear Ones and Pastries with Parents or Pals).
- One purposeful QR Code is used to gather feedback from students, staff and families regarding positive feedback to staff, school safety and a suggestion box.

ACTION STEPS TOWARD LEVEL TWO CERTIFICATION

- Each teacher selected an instructional stretch growth goal to help them grow in their practice. Their growth goal is posted in classrooms and staff are paired with Goal Buddies to dialogue/conference with one another throughout the year.
- Staff will have the opportunity to participate in Instructional Rounds for the upcoming school year. This allows all teachers to visit classrooms and strengthen instructional practices.
- Principal, Associate Principal, Instructional Coach, and Literacy Lead regularly schedule classroom visits and walkthroughs to provide timely feedback using Glows/Grows, informal feedback, and formal feedback.
- Quick data is frequently shared on growth goal progress, instructional model, and literacy implementation, i.e. quick emails, bulletin board visuals in staff lounge, and data share during staff meetings.
